SHIPPING OF DANGEROUS GOODS NEW RULES FOR INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS LIMITED QUANTITIES SHIPMENTS

If we ship dangerous goods such as perfume or detergents in limited quantities, safety is always paramount. For that reason, we closely follow international laws and regulations. We would like to let you know that the rules around *Limited Quantities* shipments (LQ) have been tightened. It is important that you adhere to these, otherwise you risk a fine or delays to your shipment. In this memo, we tell you exactly what is changing.

What do the new regulations mean for you?

It was already mandatory to affix an LQ marking to your international shipment containing dangerous goods in limited quantities (see fig. 1). You still have to do this but there will be an additional step: if you create the shipment using our shipment API, you have to provide additional information there which we then share with our international partners for DHL Europlus shipments.

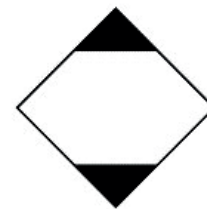

If you are using the API (see Fig. 2), you should specify:

- LQ at the options
- The actual piece weight of the shipment.
